# Waipoccer

#### It's fun! It's fast! It'ours!

If you've been on our fields you may have noticed that our goal posts have two cross bars.

We had them installed back in 2003 to be multi purpose. Bottom crossbar caters for soccer, top crossbar caters for goal kicking. The space between the crossbars is extremely valuable when we are playing Waipoccer. Waipoccer is totally unique to our school. Between 13 and 20 plus players are allowed on each team. Game begins with each team lined up on a twenty-two and and a soccer ball is placed on halfway. The whistle signals the charge of the 'light brigade' and teams endeavour to score.

Under the bottom crossbar equals one point, over the top cross bar equals two points, and through the middle of the crossbars equals three points.

There are no 'outs' and no goalies.

There are restarts only after points are scored, so it's really fast and our tamariki get super fit playing it.

It's good knowing that we are the only school in the world playing Waipoccer.
