Fitness

Fitness programmes are now in full swing. They are compulsory here at Waipa and the reasons are obvious.

Daily doses of huff and puff are enourmously beneficial for the health and wellbeing of our tamariki.

They feel better and are much more likely to be able to focus and concentrate in class. Win! Win!

I'm lucky, because I take the Senior Boys three days a week.

We work hard, support and encourage each other and it also enhances our sense of Brotherhood.

Such is the value we place on it here at Waipa, we test our tamariki. They are being tested now, and then again in November. Historically, our results have been quite remarkable.

Year 1 – 4 students do:

- Standing Jump
- 40m Sprint
- 342m Distance Run (one lap of the blue track).

Year 5 – 6:

- Standing Jump
- 14m Shuttle Run
- 727m Distance Run (two laps of the blue track).

Years 7 - 8:

- Beep Test
- Three Minute Rowing Test
- 1080m Distance Run (three laps of the blue track).

Last year, 95% of our tamariki improved their fitness levels throughout the year. Awesome!

State of O

It's been a tradition here that we offer our tamariki the opportunity to play Rugby League in a controlled environment once a week. We call it 'State of O'.
